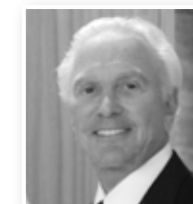

## Love of Dance Inspires a Teacher's Caring Touch

**Cindy McFarland grew up dancing.**

Motion was always a natural part of life for the Manchester, Missouri resident, and her love of movement ultimately led to work as the Department Chair of Occupational Therapy (OT) at Miriam School.

"Miriam School offers an academic emphasis but also social skills and occupational therapy and speech," says McFarland.

In her 24 years with Miriam School McFarland has seen what she calls "huge changes."

She notes that insurance reimbursements have changed over the years and other facilities might not be able to give the kind of quality OT care they used to.

"But here at Miriam," she says, "if you need it, you get it and dollars aren't the first consideration. In this environment, the students change for the better."

"If you, as a parent, have a child who is having problems, we sit down and figure out together

how to help them. Parents are so much more educated than they used to be, so they can be partners in learning how to do this at home."

The new Mary Ann Lee Gymnasium at Miriam School has made a big difference in the children's school day according to McFarland.

"Some children fear and distrust movement but now, thanks to the gym, we can work with them in a fun

and sensory way to develop functional skills, gross motor skills, core muscle strength. The gym is wonderful."

Movement, says McFarland, allows Miriam's students to learn at a higher level and be a better functioning individual. "We give them what we call a sensory diet throughout the day," she says, "and a 15-minute session will help them be more focused on learning for the next two hours."

McFarland works at Miriam Learning Center too, seeing children one on one. "It's incredible what the students can do with individual help," she says. "That's why Miriam is such a good place, because you can really give them what they need."

McFarland's therapy room includes a variety of devices that wouldn't be found in a less specialized school, including a large, flat swing.

"We are huge advocates of the swing," she says. "It gives you maximum sensory input in the shortest amount of time. For our students, it's kind of like being on a ride at Six Flags." After swing time, McFarland says, the students go back to classes and can achieve better eye contact, follow directions more closely and learn more easily.

When McFarland graduated from the University of Missouri with a degree in health science, she wanted to help older stroke victims with their rehab. But, after her clinicals, she realized her heart belonged with the children who needed her help. Twenty-four years later, she remains a smiling fixture at Miriam School.

"Every child should be allowed to learn in a stimulating and successful environment," she says. "If they don't have that, it is hard for them to be the best student they can be." **m**

## Eileen Keck Celebrates 20 Years of Volunteer Work at Miriam Switching Post

**Eileen Keck knew she was meant to work at Miriam Switching Post long before she actually began her two decades of volunteering there.**



"I worked in Clayton and spent many a lunch hour in the old store as a customer," laughs Keck who started her volunteer work nearly 20 years ago at the store that supports scholarship programs at Miriam School.

Keck recognizes her regulars and calls to them by name as they come into the Switching Post during her every-Wednesday shift. She says it's a nice social outlet for her during the week and proves it by joking with an older man who was shopping in the store.

"I'm an antique," he told her, with a twinkle in his eye.

Keck retorted: "Well sit down in one of our chairs. Maybe we can sell you together!"

The Switching Post's mission is important to Keck. "I lived my whole life in Webster Groves so I feel like I am really contributing by working to help the children at Miriam School in Webster," she says.

She has seen many changes over the past 20 years, but the biggest, according to Keck, is the contribution made by volunteer leader Linda Estell who designs the store's look. "After Linda got here, the Switching Post began to look like an upscale furniture store," says Keck.

What would she say to someone who hasn't come into the Switching Post yet?

"You're missing a good bet. It's one of the greatest places to buy furniture in St. Louis."
