Named Scholarship Fund Established

The Miriam Foundation is pleased to announce that it has recently received two generous donations for the Named Scholarship Fund (NSF). Lucy Lopata has made a donation to create The Lucy Lopata Scholarship, and the Mildred, Herbert and Julian Simon Foundation has made a donation in honor of Lucy's service to Miriam.

The NSF was created to serve as a perpetual honor or

memorial. It provides a meaningful way for donors to help financially needy students through the scholarship program. The NSF allows donors to personalize their large contributions and honor or memorialize someone.

Individual Named Scholarships are established with minimum contributions of \$25,000 to The Miriam Foundation. The contribution will be invested

in the Foundation's pooled investments and will be designated as a Permanently Restricted Scholarship Fund. The income generated from the gift's principal will be used toward a scholarship for one student each year.

Miriam Builds on 50 Years of Success

As we look forward to the Spring 2007 50th Birthday Celebration of The Miriam School, it is truly a time to take pride in the rich history and the extraordinary accomplishments of The Miriam Foundation and School.

F r o m F a i l u r e t o S u c c e s s

Children who come to The Miriam School have often experienced academic and social failure. They are very reluctant to try to meet new challenges, as they do not view themselves as successful. In our small, nurturing environment, they are taught by caring and capable faculty who know how to reach children who have complicated learning needs. Over time, our students gain the skills, strategies and confidence to succeed not only at Miriam, but in future educational environments.

U n i q u e S c h o o l i n S t . L o u i s

We are the only independent non-profit school in the St. Louis area that provides special education services *integrated* with speech/language and occupational therapies. Evolving over the decades from the small elementary school of 50 years ago, our current program helps 96 Pre-K through 8th grade students. Challenged with complex learning, attention, sensory-motor, speech and language disabilities, our students learn through a variety of cutting-edge programs, including computer and assistive technology. The Miriam School is proud to be accredited by The Independent Schools Association of the Central States (ISACS) and The North Central Association (NCA), and we are approved by the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education.

M i d d l e S c h o o l A d d e d

The Miriam School experienced particularly strong growth in the last decade. Our enrollment gradually expanded to reach our current total of 96 students. Simultaneously, we began the creation of a more sophisticated and challenging academic curriculum. During the 2002–2003 school year, we expanded our program through 8th grade, so that our students could continue to benefit from our small nurturing environment through the often difficult middle school years. Each year, since the creation of this program, our eighth grade graduating class increases in number: from five in '02–'03 to *twelve* this academic year!

M o v i n g o n f r o m M i r i a m

When students leave our school, we know they are prepared with the tools and confidence needed to give them their best chance of success in their next school setting. At Miriam, they have learned to compensate for their disabilities and they have learned the self-knowledge that will help them advocate for themselves. Our students enter into many local public and independent high schools, including Ladue High School, Webster Groves High School, and John F. Kennedy High School. We also have former students who have attended

Washington University, Webster University, St. Louis Community College, and many more post-secondary institutions, particularly as colleges and universities have become accustomed to accommodating students who learn differently.

“ W h a t M i r i a m M e a n s t o M e ” A Student’s Story by Brendan Michel

I woke up one fine summer morning expecting a normal day of watching TV, playing with my friends, and doing absolutely nothing productive, when my mom stated that I would be going to visit The Miriam School. That made me upset because I already had plans to goof around. When I arrived, the school faculty was very welcoming, the visit went pretty well, and I decided to go to The Miriam School. I went for a before-school orientation visit and I met my future teacher, Mrs. Cognata. She is one of the best teachers I have ever had the pleasure to know, and I was very happy in her class...So, basically, “What Miriam Means to Me” is everything. It is flawless in my opinion. So there you have it folks - the answer to the big question is—EVERYTHING.

Brendan was a middle school student at The Miriam School from 2003–2006. In August 2006, he enrolled at Webster Groves High School and in November 2006, based on his academic and leadership performance, he was selected as the Webster Groves High School Student of the Week.

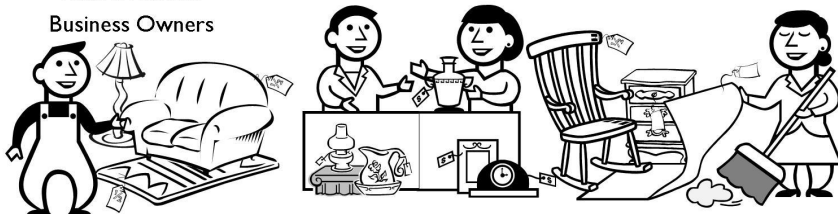
